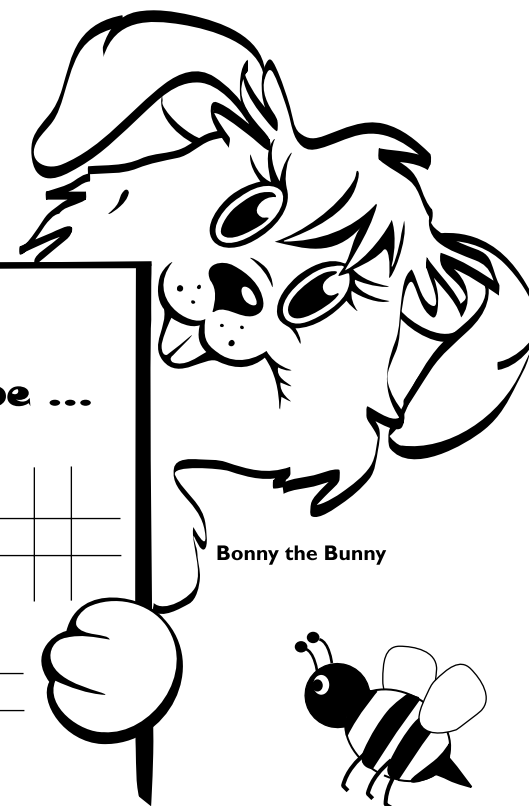
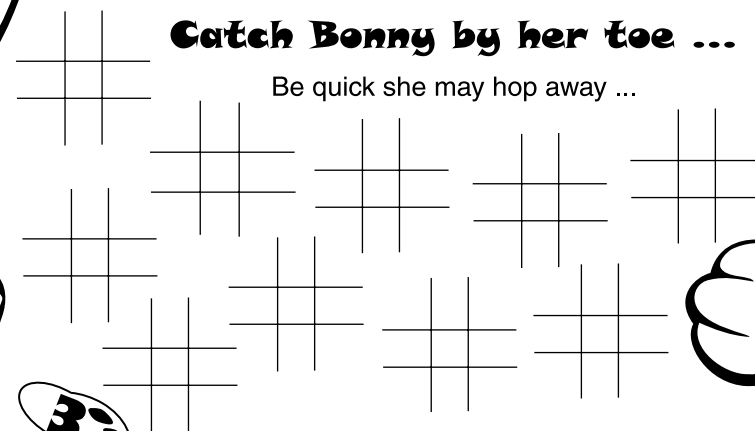
"Oh Bonny, I have extra eggs to share. It's important to share and to pay attention. Sometime you may need to return the gift of sharing," said Mayor Rabbit.



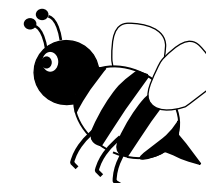

Bonny the Bunny

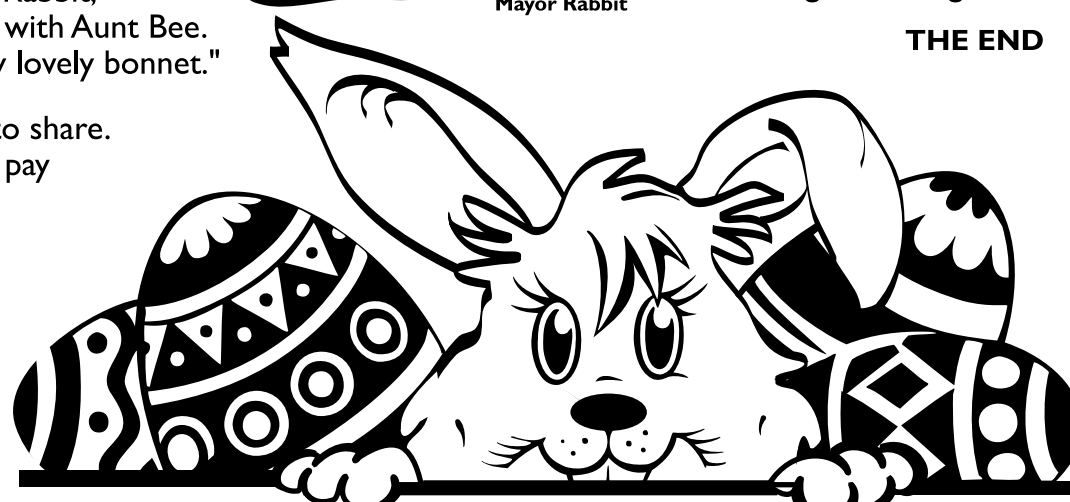

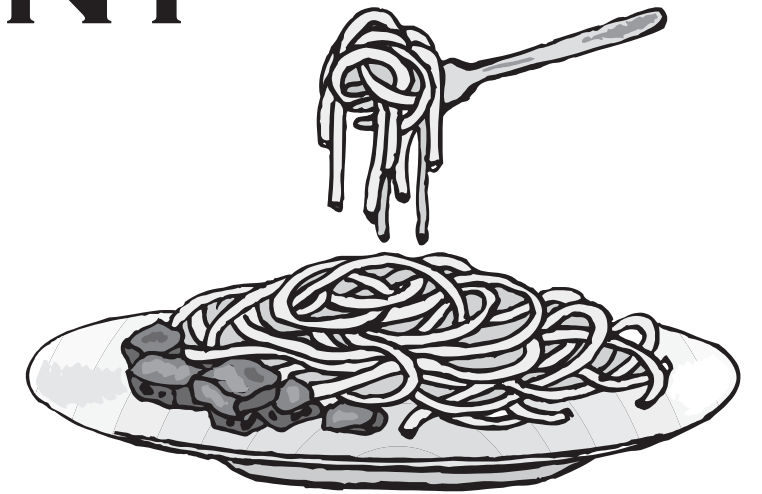

Billy feels the chill in the autumn air. Winter will be coming soon. Now it is time for him to gather and store food.



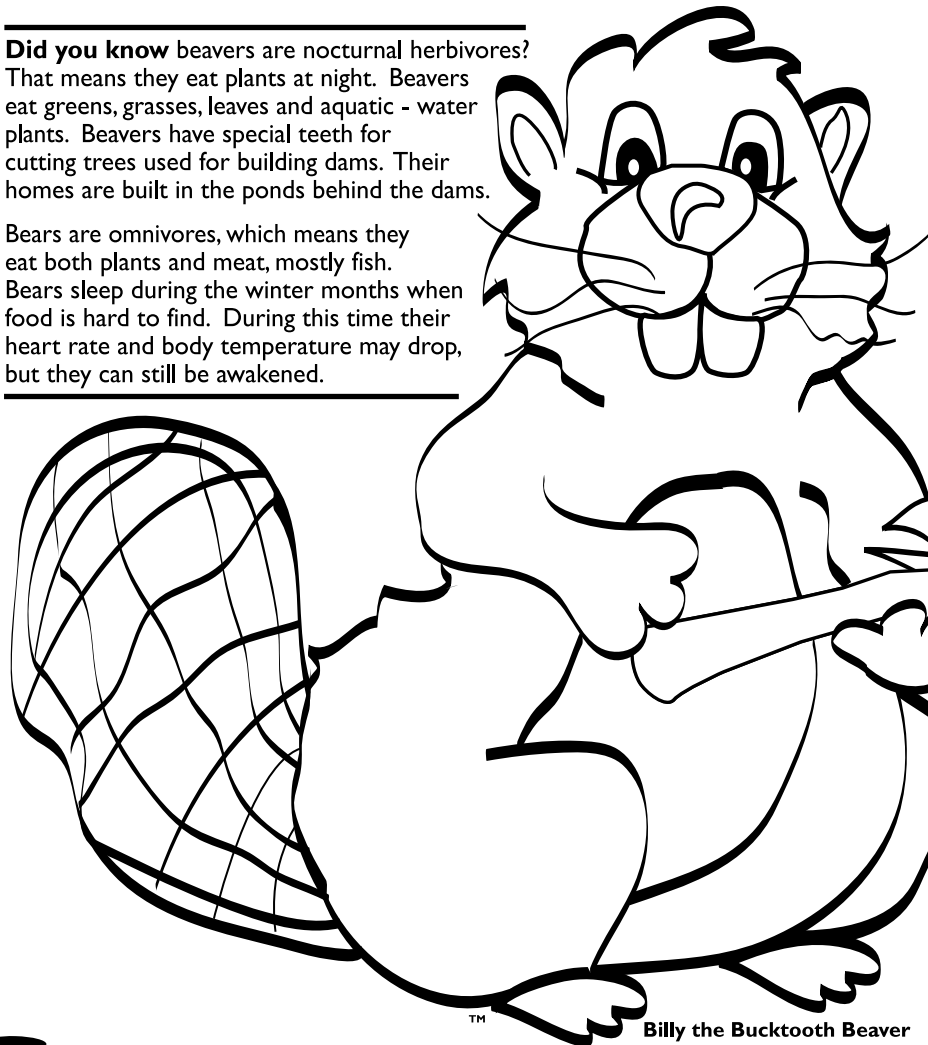
While Bobo the bear is out gathering food, he comes across Billy's dam. He thinks to himself, "I'm going to have to tear down this dam so I can fish."

"I did," said Bobo, "your dam stops the fish from swimming upstream and I'm one hungry bear."

Did you know beavers are nocturnal herbivores? That means they eat plants at night. Beavers eat greens, grasses, leaves and aquatic - water plants. Beavers have special teeth for cutting trees used for building dams. Their homes are built in the ponds behind the dams.

Bears are omnivores, which means they eat both plants and meat, mostly fish. Bears sleep during the winter months when food is hard to find. During this time their heart rate and body temperature may drop, but they can still be awakened.



Billy the Bucktooth Beaver



Billy and Bobo knew they had to compromise and work together. They decided to rebuild the dam to create a pond for cranberries and other water plants to grow. They also decided the new dam had to be low enough so the larger fish could jump over.

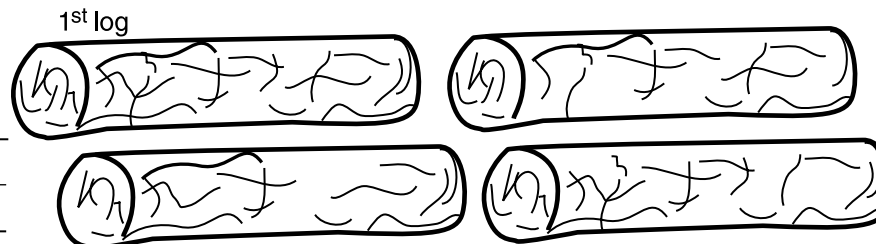

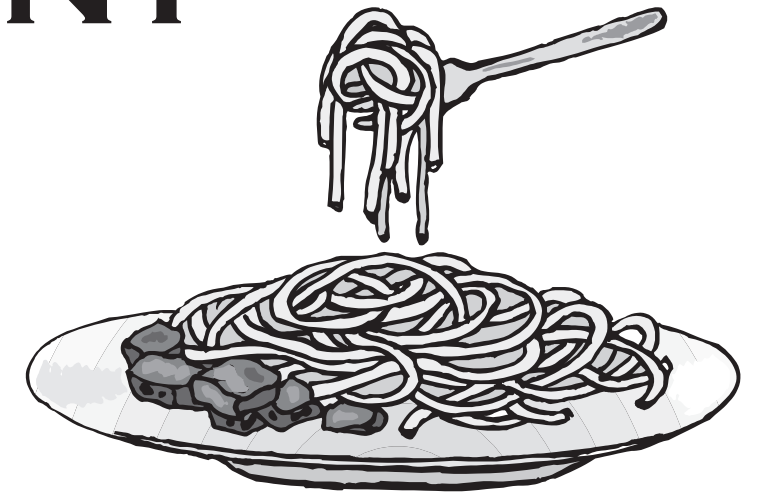

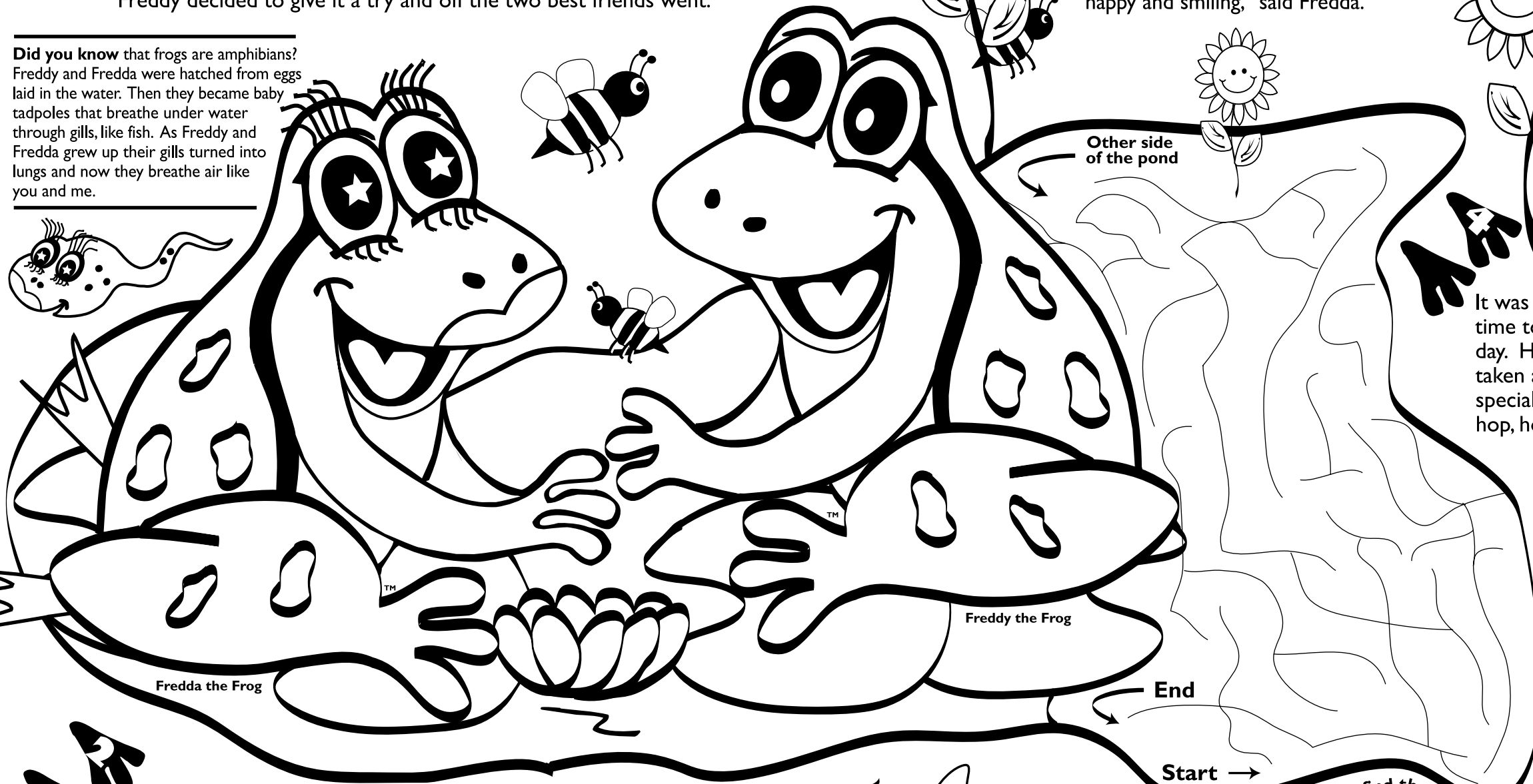
"Good morning Freddy," Fredda said with a twinkle winkle in her eye, "lets go on an adventure to the other side of the pond."

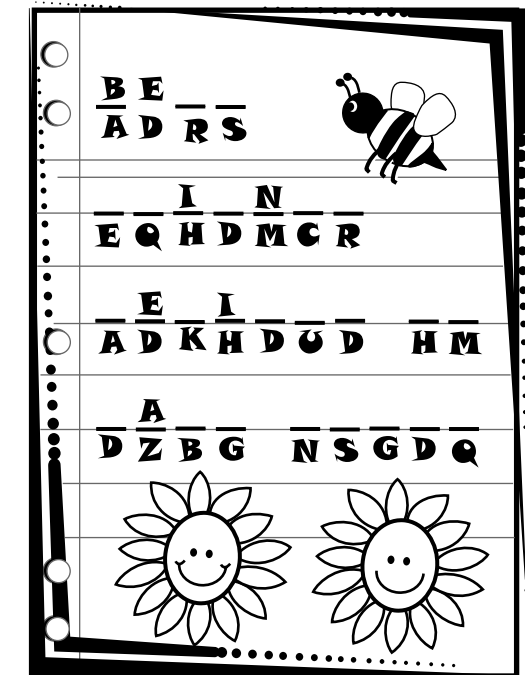

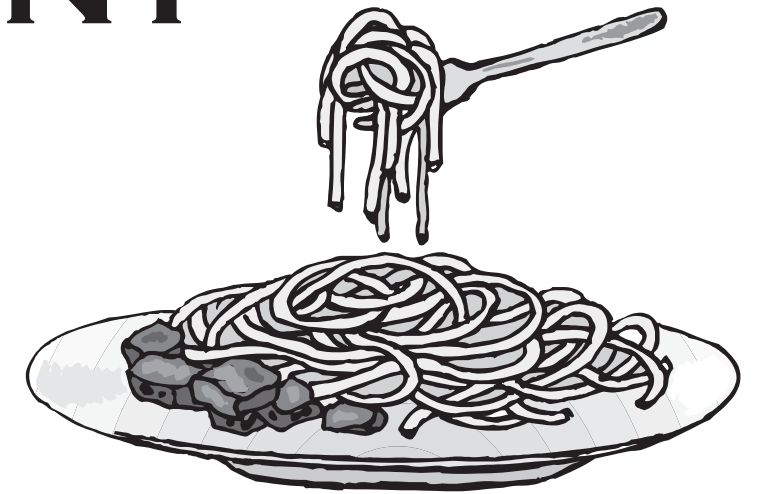

Milly the Mouse and Mouser the Cat: the True Meaning of Trust

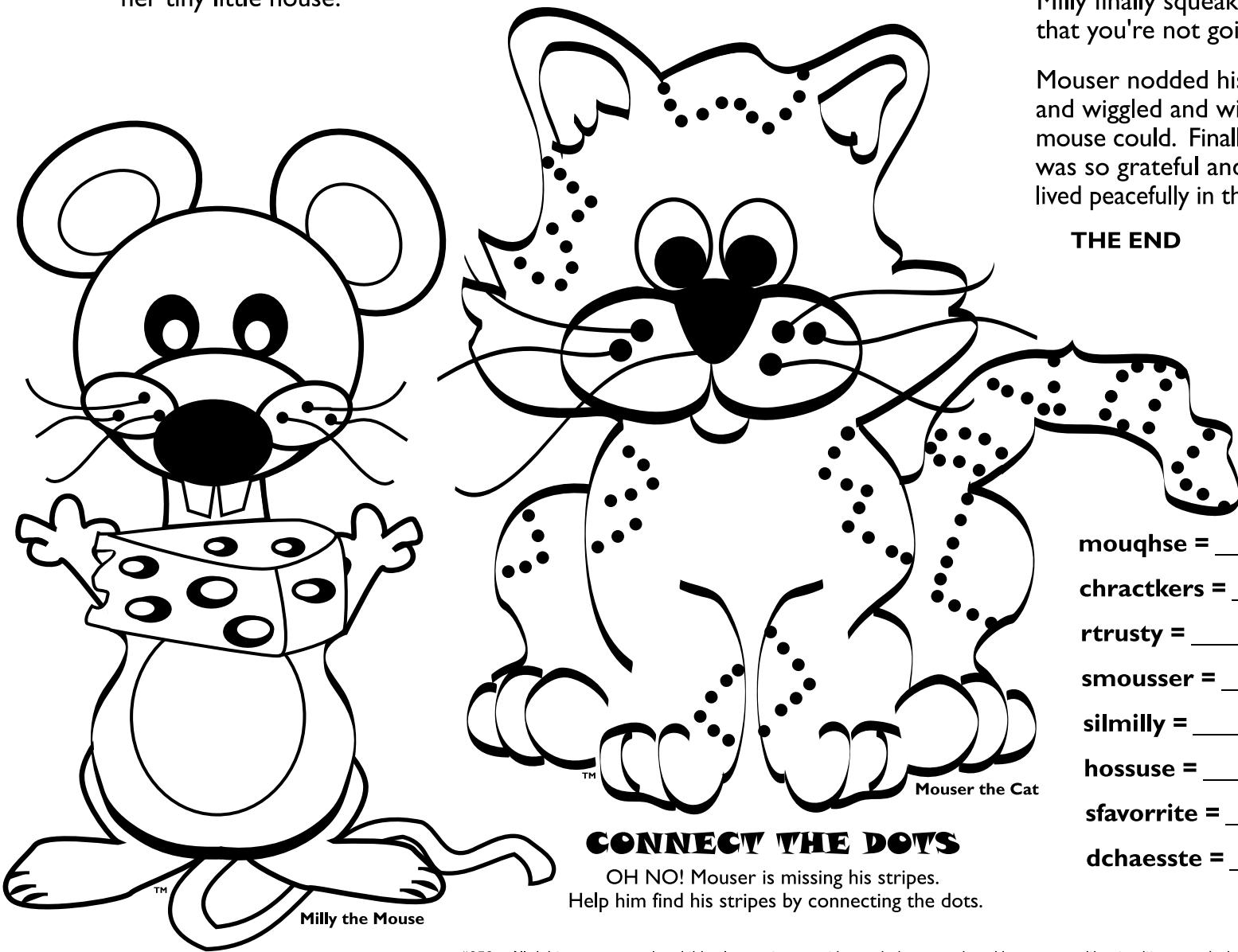

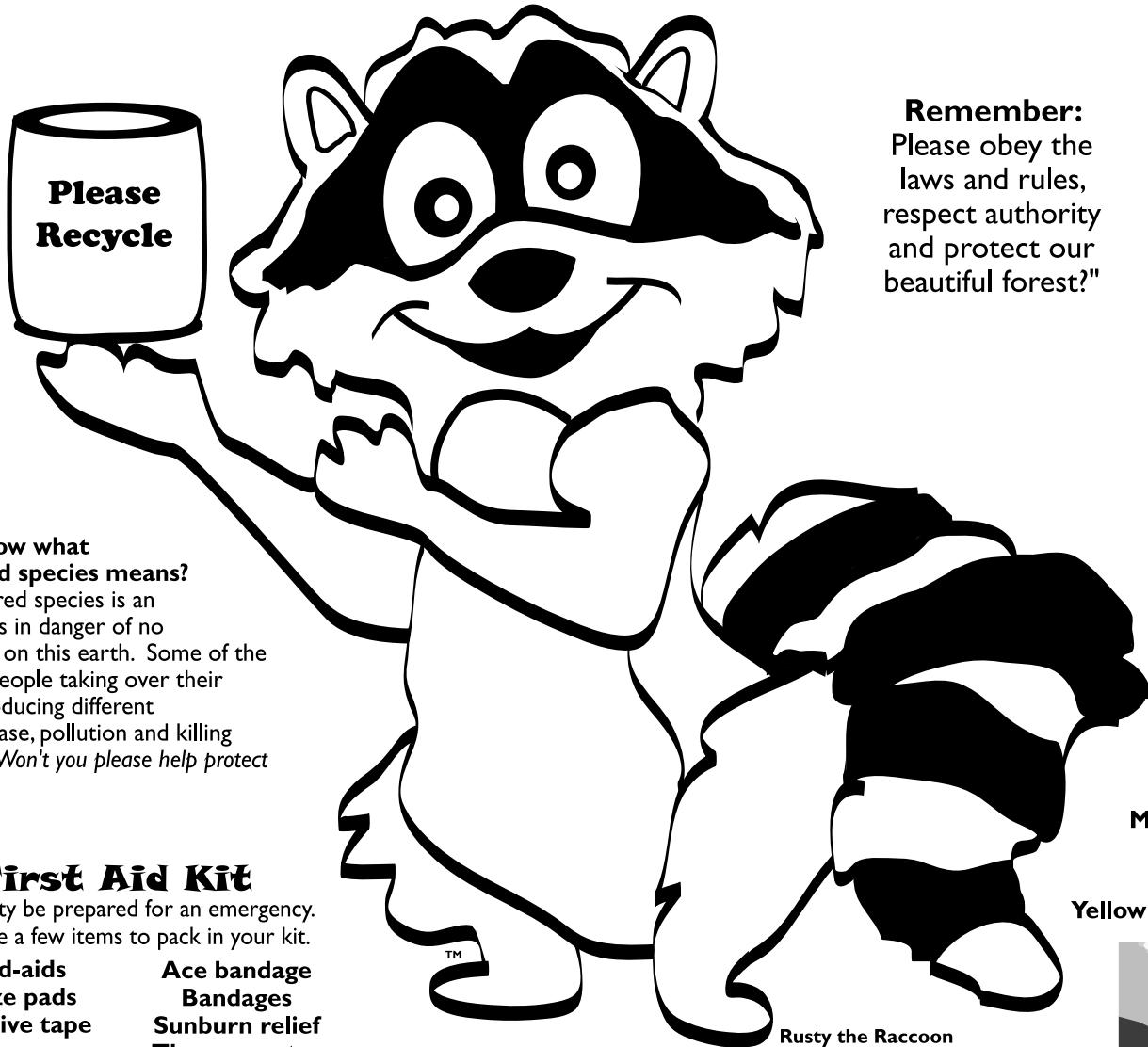
Rusty the Raccoon: Keeping It Clean and Green

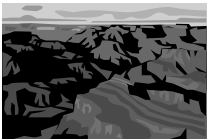
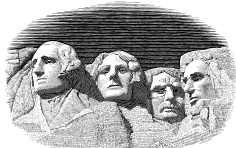

GENERAL CAMPING RULES

Help Rusty learn to be a responsible camper.

- 1 Respect animals and the nature that surrounds you. Be aware of any dangerous animals such as bears, poisonous snakes and plants.
- 2 Leave the campsite the way you found it. Pick up any garbage to make it even cleaner.
- 3 Be aware of your surroundings. Walk around the site looking for any overhead branches, anthills, and the terrain such as any low areas that could flood.
- 4 Make sure your campfire is properly contained and controlled. Campfires are the number one camping danger. Have your fire pit deep enough, ringed with large rocks and not built anywhere around trees or other foliage. Never play around an open campfire or leave the fire unwatched.
- 5 Make sure the water you drink is not dangerous. Bring your own, boil it or use a purifier with your parents help.
- 6 Keep your campsite clean and free from food that may attract animals. Always throw garbage away, clean the meal area, and hang your food in a tightly sealed container a fair distance away from your campsite.

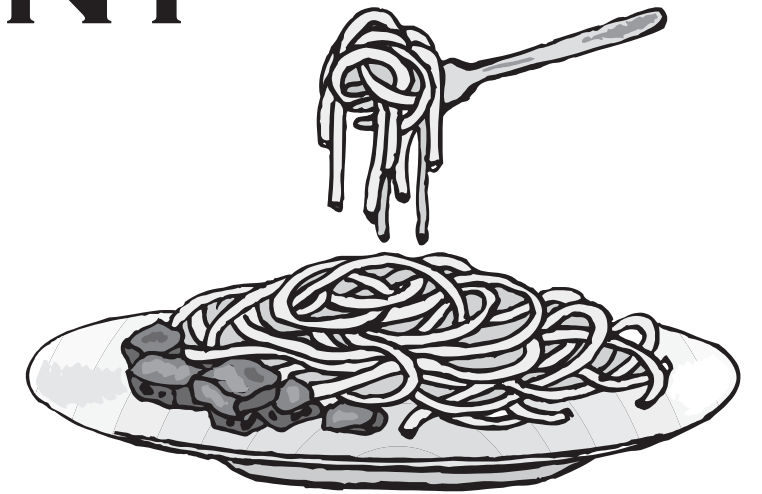
